Please provide any historical evidence or reference data:

1. The Village Green milepost was put in place in 1898. It was used to inform travellers of the distances to the surrounding villages including Rowton and Littleton, as well as areas that are now suburbs of Chester, Hoole and Piper's Ash.
2. The A41 milepost indicated distance to villages en route to Whitchurch e.g. Waverton, Tattenhall, Handley and Broxton. All these places are effectively by-passed by the modern roads.
