Constructed in 2010 in sandstone reclaimed from a redundant bus shelter that used to stand on the corner of Village Road and Quarry Lane. The map was drawn by Gordon Emery and was inspired by the calligraphic, historical maps that were hand-drawn by Christleton resident of many years, the late Cliff Boddy.

The sloping information board is sandwiched between raised planters for bedding plants.

The whole sandstone planter and information sign was donated by Derek Morgan as a memorial to his wife Myra and they lived in Haulfryn, the cottage nearby in Village Road.
