The Ring o' Bells is a large dominant building adjacent to the village centre. The original public house on the site was probably built in the early 19th Century - it was remodelled in 1892 and has more recently been extended. Until 1970 the Ring o' Bells was known as the Red Lion, an earlier Ring o' Bells having existed until 1884 on the land now occupied by the Parish Hall.
